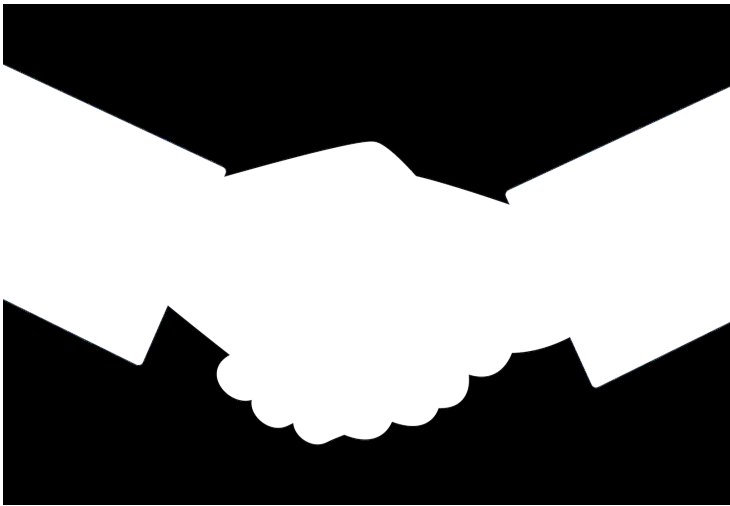


Kokilaben Hospital, Varian Medical Systems unite to offer School for Stereotactic Radiotherapy
