India has approximately 800 medical device manufacturers, but standard regulation for materials used in medical devices still remains a major concern for the health sector. Currently, only 37 categories of medical devices are regulated in India under the Indian Medical Device Rule (IMDR 2017). India's medical devices industry has grown from \$2.2 billion to \$5.2 billion at a compounded annual growth rate (CAGR) of 15.8%.
