

Dr. Ajai Chowdhry donates 1.2 Crores to help fight COVID-19

In wake of the ongoing nation-wide lockdown to mitigate the Covid-19 pandemic, and to support the National Capital Territory of Delhi in its response against the deadly virus, Dr. Ajai Chowdhry, a recipient of the prestigious Padma Bhushan Award, has contributed INR 1.2 crore. The funds have gone towards arranging 80,000 meals for the poor and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) kits for 7,000 doctors, nurses and other frontline health workers in Delhi.

Commenting on the same, Dr. Ajai Chowdhry said, “It is time for us to collectively respond to the COVID-19 pandemic in our best capacity. Governments, private entities, and philanthropic organizations must come together to act swiftly to ensure food and medical aid is made available to those who need it the most.
