It is planned to be a 150-innovators Innovation Challenge at Rajiv Gandhi University campus through online Microsoft Teams platform.

The selected teams will be given the opportunity to get mentored by the leading life sciences incubation centre, BBC and entrepreneurial activity hub, NSRCEL of IIM-B. RGUHS has also partnered with IISc, IIIT-B, GHA and Elsevier for this event.

An Ideathon was held online on 8th of June to provide the platform for students to explore their potential and showcase their mettle for innovative solutions for myriad challenges in COVID-19 healthcare and related issues. BBC was featured as favourite destination for life sciences start-ups.
