

Karnataka State budget charts projects with multi-crore allocation

Bulk Drug Park to come up at Kadechuru Industrial Area, Yadgir at a cost of Rs 1,478 crore with assistance from Centre



BS Yediyurappa, Chief Minister, Karnataka has presented the state budget for 2021-22.

Key highlights for the healthcare & pharma sectors include-

- Bulk Drug Park to come up at Kadechuru Industrial Area, Yadgir at a cost of Rs 1,478 crore with assistance from Centre.
- ICUs of 25-bed and 6-bed capacities will be established in 19 districts and 100 taluka hospitals at a cost of Rs 60 crore in the next two years
- The government will set up an anti-microbial resistance unit for Rs one crore.
- Laboratories will be set up at Rs 10 crore to detect hereditary metabolic diseases at Bengaluru and Ballari, to reduce the infant mortality rate.
- Rs 2 crore allocated for Tele-ICU facilities.
- Ayurvedic College in Shivamogga to be upgraded to Ayush University.
- Regional cancer centres to come up along the lines of Kidwai Hospital at Mysuru and Shivamogga at a cost of Rs 100 crore.
- To encourage Ayurvedic medicine in veterinary science, a new research institute to come up at a cost of Rs 2 crore at Veterinary College, Shivamogga.
- Government's aim is to reduce the death and impairment caused by snake bites to 50% by the year 2030. An Anti-Venom Research and Development Centre will be established at a cost of Rs 7 crore to develop next generation antivenom and to provide it at an affordable price and make it available easily. An amount of Rs 2 crore would be allocated in the financial year 2021-22 for this purpose.

"We welcome the measures announced by BS Yediyurappa in State Budget 2021-22. The budget rightly strikes a reasonable balance in addressing the key pillars of health and well-being. The array of measures announced are in line with our

expectations. The substantial allocation in newborn screening and genomics will help detect hereditary metabolic diseases, controlling child mortality rate.
