

Ayush minister launches campaign to distribute prophylactic medicines at NIA, Jaipur

Minister of Ayush and Port, Shipping & Waterways Sarbananda Sonowal launched a campaign of distributing Ayush prophylactic medicines and written guidelines on diet and lifestyle at National Institute of Ayurveda (NIA), Jaipur as part of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav'. The campaign will see the distribution of Sanshamani Vati, which is also known as Guduchi or Giloy Ghan Vati, and Ashwagandha Ghan Vati to 75 lakh people across the country, with a special focus on the geriatric (people of 60 years and above age) population and the front-line workers in the next one year.
