

Maharashtra Govt to strengthen medical education and healthcare workforce

Boosting access to quality and affordable healthcare



The Medical Education and Drugs Department (MEDD) and International Finance Corporation (IFC) have joined forces to prioritise healthcare projects with an emphasis on medical education under the public-private partnership (PPP) model in Maharashtra.

Marking the collaboration, and deliberating on the roadmap, MEDD and IFC recently organised an investor conference themed around strengthening medical education and tertiary healthcare in Mumbai. Subhash Desai, Minister, Industries, Mines and Marathi Language Department and Amit Vilasrao Deshmukh Minister, Medical Education and Cultural Affairs Department, inaugurated the event, where they emphasised the Government of Maharashtra's strategic focus on health care projects, including the recently notified health PPP policy.
