

ICMR inks MoA with National Cancer Grid to revolutionise cancer care

A collaboration to promote clinical trials for cancer

Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), the apex body in India for the formulation, coordination and promotion of biomedical research, has signed a Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) with National Cancer Grid (NCG), an initiative of the Government of India through the Department of Atomic Energy and its grant-in-aid institution, the Tata Memorial Centre.

The objective of the MoA is exclusively for clinical trials, focusing on the development of novel affordable therapies for Indiaspecific cancers and cancers common in India.

The agreement covers joint funding for multicentric, multidisciplinary, interventional trials for common/unique cancers.

The National Cancer Grid (NCG) has been established to create a network of cancer centres, research institutes, patient groups and charitable institutions across India with the objective of developing uniform standards of patient care for prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of cancer; providing specialised training and education in oncology and facilitating collaborative basic, translational and clinical research in cancer. NCG today has over 270 hospitals in its network across India.
