Since joining Intuitive in 2018, he has held key leadership roles, including area sales director for India and director of commercial operations for Asia, where he contributed to the expansion of Intuitive's commercial operations capabilities and range of global offerings across India and broader Asia region including China, Japan, South Korea, and Taiwan.

Intuitive began direct operations in India in 2018 and has focused on advancing minimally invasive care across the country

through the adoption of its robotic-assisted surgical systems. The company has invested \$6 million to establish four training centres across India, including at AIIMS New Delhi. Today, there are more than 180 da Vinci surgical programmes across India, with more than 1 lakh procedures performed by more than 850 da Vinci trained surgeons.

To support its expanding operations, Intuitive recently opened a global capability centre (GCC) in Bengaluru.
