Asia's first dedicated cancer centre for women



Apollo Hospitals Enterprise Ltd (AHEL) has announced the launch of Apollo Athena – Asia's First Dedicated Cancer Centre for Women, located in Defence Colony, New Delhi.

According to data from GLOBOCAN 2022 estimates, nearly 54% of incidence among women in India is attributed to cancers that majorly affect women, including breast and cervical cancers.
