### Shailesh Ayyangar takes over as OPPI president



With the aim of encouraging innovation in India, Organisation of Pharmaceutical Producers of India (OPPI) has instituted, as public private partnership initiative along with NIPER and CSIR, OPPI Scientists and Young Scientists Awards.

"Access to innovative medicines can change the health of a nation. As an industry, we are committed to delivering innovative medicines that address the unmet medical needs of India.
